Community Education Shift

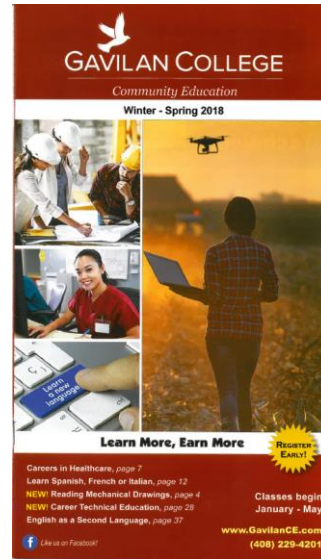
- Purposeful transition into Career Education

The Fresh Success Program

- Federal Funded Match Program providing supportive services to students receiving CalFresh benefits.
- Extends benefits to Community College students receiving CalFresh benefits who may not be eligible otherwise.
- Partnership with:
 - California Community Colleges Foundation
 - California Department of Social Services
 - Food and Nutrition Services
 - Local Counties
 - Community Colleges





Minimum Eligibility

- Receiving/Eligible to receive CalFresh benefits.
- Enrolled/Plan to enroll in eligible courses.
 - Career Education, Basic Skills, CWE, GED, ESL, Community Education.

Food Pantry Successes

- Since 2016 increased number served by over 35%
- 98% of food is donated;
- Assisted over 50 students with CalFresh Applications since Spring 2018;
- Hungry Free Campus Dollars fund two student workers at 100%



Food Pantry Successes

- 1st Tuesday each month fresh produce is delivered;
- 3rd Thursday each month perishable and nonperishable items provided;
- Extended hours of pantry M-TH 9am-4:30pm;
- Extended CalFresh Outreach and Application Assistance to Hollister & Morgan Hill sites.
